Dear Mr. Elhassan:

This is in response to your correspondence dated December 15, 2003, in which you allege that your civil rights have been violated by a number of federal agencies and public officials, namely the CIA, Judge Thomas E. Gallahue, and attorney Meghan Matulka. Specifically, you claim that the CIA harassed and intimidated you during your recruitment process, and that Judge Gallahue and attorney Matulka subsequently conspired with the CIA to "script" your case "in the most literal sense" to stop you from bringing a lawsuit against government officials.

The Criminal Section of the Civil Rights Division has the responsibility of enforcing federal criminal civil rights statutes. The enforcement activity primarily involves deprivations of civil rights under color of law, and generally the use of excessive physical force by law enforcement officers.


We have carefully reviewed the information which you furnished. However, we have determined that your complaint does not involve a prosecutable violation of federal criminal civil rights statutes. Accordingly, we are unable to assist you.
